Written Quiz:

This is a 10 question, fill in the blank quiz. All of the answers can be found on your vocabulary page, throughout the power point slideshows, and in the Jules Struppeck reading. I will announce the actual questions and answers one day during class-when you least expect it (so don't ask me when I'm going to give you the questions, just make sure you attend class regularly enough that you are present when I do).

Final Project:

Using any of the materials and techniques we have covered, combinations of materials and techniques we have covered, or even ones we haven't covered (talk to me about your ideas), make a "portrait" of yourself. This is wide open, the "portrait" need not be a representation of your appearance (though it can be). It can represent ideas you have. The size is up to you but should be meaningful to your concept. Choose the material or materials that are most appropriate to your personality, they are likely to be ones that you excelled with.

Review the elements and principles of 3-D Design and the Jules Struppeck reading.

Type a paragraph (10-12 pt font, single spaced, 250-500 words) which describes why you chose your materials (more than "I had some left over from the other project"). Next, describe which of the elements and principles of design you feel are most prominent in your work and which ones you hoped to emphasize. Finally, tell me what- besides your appearance-you think this portrait describes about you. You will be sharing this paragraph with the class as part of the critique (so don't write things about yourself that you can't bear to share with others).

Evaluation for this project will be split equally between Craftsmanship (5 points) and Design (5 points). The written component will be evaluated as part of the design portion of the grade. You will receive no more than ½ credit for your work if you miss the final critique. You will receive a one letter grade reduction on the project if you are late for or miss parts of the final critique.
